




# Nepal Experience on CPER

- ❑ National Climate Change Policy 2011
  - ❑ Environment Protection Act 1997
  - ❑ Environment Protection Regulation 1998
  - ❑ Ministry of Environment apex body of climate change issues.
  - ❑ Provision of Climate change fund to mobilize national and international sources.
  - ❑ CPER provides budget code

# Objective of CPER

- ❑ To identify expenditure related climate change activities incurred by different Ministries
  - ❑ To foresee the resource gap for climate change activities.
  - ❑ Harmonization of international financial support.
  - ❑ To make assure if the fund have reached at grass root level .
- 

# Method of CPER calculations

- ❑ CPER Code will provided only capital expenditure.
  - ❑ Each activity marked as “Yes” if the activity belongs to climate change and “No” if not.
  - ❑ All activities of the project have been given different weightage and total weightage is 100.
- 

# Climate Change Budget code

Climate change Expenditure	Relevance to Climate Change	Code to be assigned in the budget sheet
If the expected expenditure is more than 60 percent of the total budget	Highly Relevant	1
If the expected expenditure is 20 to 60 percent of the total budget	Relevant	2
If the expected expenditure is less than 20 percent of the total budget	Neutral	3
